### SHAKE THE KNOWLEDGE TREE:

Last month, Cynthia Sanoy asked for information about photo transfer to fabric.

I have used photo transfer with some success. The method I used is the special paper that you print on and then heat transfer onto fabric. I used two different kinds, one where the paper had to be peeled after it had cooled and then one where you have to peel the paper off while it is still hot. In both cases the results were acceptable (not rubbery), although the "hand" of the fabric was slightly altered, but then I did not expect to sew through the transfer. One thing to remember with this method is that the image will be flipped, unless you flip the original prior to printing.
